**Seminar topic:** Climate change and adaptation strategies

**Description:** This is a half-day seminar held by the Indigenous Water Project. This seminar will include presentations and participant discussions about recommended reading and will focus on regional and global adaptation strategies discussed in scientific and academic literature.
