

What you need to know before signing up for this training program.

COURSE ORIENTATION MEETING / MANDATORY

You must attend the orientation meeting .

Tuesday September 8th —5—7pm

Marine Station at West Bay Marina

Tuition Deposit is Required

- Minimum age for dive training course – 18
- Course duration is 160 hours (20-days) and may be conducted on weekdays and/or weekends (see attached schedule) Actual course schedule varies due to class comprehension, achieving learning objectives, logistics, weather and tides.
- Diving Medical exam with physicians approval to dive may be required prior to course entry.
- Physical fitness—You must be physically fit for strenuous activities . You must pass a Physical Strength, Swimming & Agility Test (PSSAT)
- High school diploma or equivalent
- Drug and alcohol free during training
- Equipment rental/usage. You are responsible for all equipment in your care and for its return before receiving diploma. Damage repairs may be charged to student
- The training is rigorous. You should be well rested, ready to learn in a classroom environment

Physical Strength, Swimming & Agility Test (PSSAT):

Commercial diving is a hazardous and physically demanding activity. PSSAT and the swim test are designed to show that you have what it takes to become a harvest diver. This test includes the following exercises:

- Swim test (swim unaided in a pool 250yds non-stop)
- Survival float (float unaided in a pool for 15-minutes, deep water)
- Underwater swimming (swim underwater unaided 15 yards on one breath)
- Diving (recover a 10lb weight unaided from the deep end of a pool)
- Weight belt carry (carry a 50lb commercial diving weight belt 500yds on land)

PROFESSIONAL HARVEST DIVER TRAINING (160 hours– 4 weeks)

THIS IS NOT A SHORT COURSE

The NMS Harvest Diver Training program is designed to meet the skill and knowledge requirements for Northwest Tribal members who have the serious desire to become a qualified commercial harvest diver in the following areas:

- Scuba-equipment & techniques
- Surface-Supplied Air—equipment & techniques
- Diving safety procedures
- Diving physics, medical aspects & physiology
- Decompression theory
- Rigging & working underwater
- Diving First Aid / CPR
- Emergency Oxygen Administration for diving accidents
- Diving Accident Mgmt. & Rescue Techniques
- Equipment maintenance and field repairs

This specialized training is based on dive industry and government standards for commercial diving including:

- **Occupational Safety and Health Administration** (Standards for commercial diving operations)
- **Washington Administrative Code** (Standards for commercial diving operations)
- **Natl. Association of Underwater Instructors** (SCUBA diving standards & policies)

This training is recognized through:

- **National Association of Underwater Instructors (Scuba)**
- **Western Washington Indian Training & Employment Program (WWITEP)**
- **13 northwest tribes**
