

The Nisqually Health Clinic is moving toward the use of a better and more complete Medical Record. Right now, your medical information is safely stored in a big folder called a Medical Chart.



These charts take up a lot of space and they're getting larger. The information in large charts are sometimes hard to find and read.

Every time you come into see a healthcare provider at the clinic a hand-written note is made about the care you received. This piece of paper is placed into your Medical Chart so that we have a record of your concerns and treatments.

Some of the information about your visits are stored in a computer system called RPMS. Our new system will be able to hold all of your medical information. This means we will no longer have to keep hand-written information in a paper Medical Chart.



When you meet a service provider, at the clinic, you may see them typing on computers during your visit. Information about your visit to the clinic is available right away for other service providers to see.

This will help coordinate your insurance information with your referrals and labs.

Our new computer system will help make all of the treatment you receive safer. It will improve your care at the pharmacy, as well.

Ok so what if your big computer crashes?



Our expanded system is backed up daily and can be brought online within minutes. That way your health information is always secure and available to the providers who need it.

Who can see what's in my record?

Only authorized Nisqually Health Dept. providers and staff will be able to look at your Electronic Health Record. Your information is protected by two passwords.
