QUOTAS:

Eligible returning divers may take up to 2,160 pounds of their original IDQ in Subregion C (the Nisqually area) and

675 pounds in Subregion B (the In-common area).

New and Recertified divers may take up to 1,000 pounds in

Subregion C (the Nisqually area.).

REPORTING:

All geoduck clam sales must be recorded on Treaty Indian Fish Receiving Tickets. The following information should be included: 2012 Geoduck Atlas tract number, commercial pounds, harvester name, buyer name and harvester signature.

Subsistence pounds must be recorded separately on the monitor

weigh out slips.

OTHER PROVISIONS

Harvest activities must comply with the Tribal 2025/26 Annual

Shellfish Regulations.

Only Nisqually Tribal members or NDNR staff are allowed on Nisqually vessels unless otherwise approved in writing by the

Nisqually Fish Commission.

Commingling Geoduck clams from tracts is strictly prohibited. Geoduck must be weighed out and tagged prior to leaving the Tract.

All boat captains shall radio/call the geoduck monitor as each diver enters/exits the water.

Individuals are solely responsible for tracking the pounds remaining in their IDQ.

Disposing of geoduck shell in marine waters is prohibited.

Harvest available Geoduck clam resource.
